We have also now had our very first CCP meeting, where we discussed antisocial behaviour, the new website and anything and everything related to customer engagement! This group of residents support both the CSC and us, to get things right for you!

CUSTOMER SCRUTINY INSPECTORS (CSIs)

WHAT IS CUSTOMER SCRUTINY?

We work with our customers, to ensure we thoroughly examine, or scrutinise, the service we offer. A Customer Scrutiny Inspector (CSI) is a bit like a 'secret shopper', but it's so much more too.

They are trained YHG residents - tenants or leaseholders - who offer their time to review our services before offering conclusions and recommendations for change.

WHAT TYPE OF THINGS DO THEY DO?

On a recent review, CSIs looked at previous customer dissatisfaction within fix360, our repairs service, to help inform improvements in the service. During a two-week period, adhering to all data protection protocols, our CSIs called a sample of customers to talk about their

experiences, before their findings and recommendations were presented to the Customer Service Committee (CSC).

On this occasion, CSIs presented eight recommendations, which were agreed and have now been implemented by the business.

SAFETY IN SUMMER

Our adventurous little ones can often place themselves in danger without realising the potential consequences.

So, what can we do to make sure our children are safe during the summer holidays?

- Paddling pools can be great fun to splash around in during the summer months.
 However, it can take just a minute for children to drown in a few centimetres of water. Never leave children to play unattended.
- Many trampolines aren't suitable for children under six as they're not yet sufficiently developed to be able to control their bouncing. Always choose a trampoline with a net.
- Nothing says summer like the smell
 of burning sausages on a barbeque.
 Make sure your barbeque is on a level,
 stable surface and keep little ones from
 venturing too close.
- We all love being out in the sun, but too
 much can cause painful sunburn and
 dehydration. Make sure you keep babies


MONSAL TRAIL:

We had a great day last month as residents joined us to celebrate the official opening of The Hope Centre in Partington.

Throughout the pandemic, The Hope Centre and its volunteers found that many people needed support with food shopping, food parcels, collecting prescriptions, wellbeing calls and much more. It was a real community support network and it highlighted just how much the community needed this support more long-term.

So, along with Trafford Housing Trust and our colleagues within fix360, we have worked tirelessly for six weeks to renovate the old takeaway shop into a real community hub.

It's now an affordable fresh food store, food bank and second-hand uniform store as well as sharing help and referral services and a meeting space.

Ruth Lancey, Director of the Hideaway and The Hope Centre said,

"The Hope Centre sits right at the heart of this brilliant community that is struggling against poverty and deprivation. We couldn't do a project like this without support from organisations like Your Housing Group and Trafford Housing Trust. The only way we've been able to give thousands and thousands of food parcels out to the community is thanks to these organisations that have stepped up and contributed."

ONGOING IMPROVEMENT WORKS

Ryfields Retirement village is currently undergoing significant investment works, both externally and internally.

The improved works will see the village benefit from a new roof, heating upgrades, fire safety improvements, as well as new front doors, solar panels, electric charging points plus new kitchens and bathrooms.

Communal upgrades will also include the introduction of a snooker room and scooter store and upgrades to the current craft room, library and quiet rooms with new carpets throughout.

MAKING COMMUNITIES SAFER

Your Housing Group is proud to have got behind the UK's first official antisocial behaviour (ASB) week.

We've become a Resolve member, the company behind the week, and whose sole focus is upon community safety and ASB.

We take ASB very seriously at YHG and will always listen to your concerns and act on them.

WHAT IS ASB?

ASB is defined in law as,

"conduct that has caused, or is likely to cause, harassment, alarm or distress to any person".

The law also gives specific definitions of ASB in housing as,

"conduct capable of causing nuisance or annoyance to a person...or in relation to [their] occupation of residential premises". YHG defines ASB as being conduct that, "causes or is likely to cause a nuisance or annoyance to anyone directly or indirectly as to interfere with the quiet enjoyment of their home or affects our housing management functions" or "consists of or involves using or threatening to use our homes and neighbourhoods for an unlawful purpose".



HOW SHOULD I REPORT ASB TO YHG?

Call 999 if you, or anyone in your neighbourhood, is in immediate danger. If it's a non-emergency, call the police by calling 101.

If you experience problems, it is important to keep an up-to-date record of events, noting the day, date, time, and nature of the behaviour causing you annoyance or distress.

We know that COVID-19 is still with us and whilst the Prime Minister has now given the green light to lift almost all restrictions, and try to return to normal and learn to live with COVID-19, he did emphasise that we must all do this sensibly and respectfully.

We know that everyone will feel very differently about this, and we want to work with all of you, and our colleagues, to unlock safely, together.

WHAT UNLOCKING MEANS FOR YHG AND FIX360

WHAT'S CHANGED?

- Our colleagues now choose whether to wear
 a face covering, inside and outside. However,
 if they are visiting you in your home, for whatever
 reason, they will always ask you if you'd prefer
 them to wear a face covering. This applies
 to lettings/sales teams as well.
- Two-metre social distancing has been removed; however, please respect our colleagues' and your neighbours' space
- You will no longer be asked to leave the room if somebody visits for repairs or maintenance, however, please give them space

- Our grounds maintenance teams and operatives will no longer wear '2m social distancing' high-visibility vests
- · One-way systems in buildings will be removed
- People can return to lift sharing, however, please be mindful that not everybody will feel comfortable doing so.

WHAT'S STAYED THE SAME?

- Hand hygiene: where hand sanitisers are installed, they will remain
- Protective Perspex screens will stay in scheme reception areas
- fix360 operatives will still call ahead to ask if anybody is self-isolating
- You still won't be asked to digitally sign completion certificates on our operatives' handsets after a repair is finished for now.

Your safety, and that of our colleagues is YHG's number one priority and that includes people's mental health and wellbeing too. Please show compassion and respect at all times.

KEEPING YOU SAFE



Draft Building Safety Bill

Presented to Parliament by the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government by Comma of Her Majesty July 2020

Yours and our colleagues'
safety is our top priority
and as you know we are
closely following the progress
of the Building Safety Bill.

On 30 June 2021, it was introduced into Parliament and will now take approximately nine months for the Bill to receive what is known as Royal Assent, after which it will become the Building Safety Act which means it is law.

The Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) said

"[The Bill is] the next step in ground-breaking reforms to give residents and homeowners more rights, powers and protections — making homes across the country safer".

For housing associations such as ourselves, it sets out proposed legislative changes that will establish a new building safety regime in England and also implement the recommendations of the Hackitt Review, which followed the tragic 2017 Grenfell Tower fire.

SOME OF THE BILL CHANGES



Put in place measures that ensure homeowners can have a clearer path to redress



All homeowners to have 15 years to claim compensation, increased from the current six



Introduce a Building Safety Regulator within the Health and Safety Executive (HSE)



Change the regulations and standards for the construction of high-risk buildings



Make provisions to support the removal of unsafe cladding



existing high-rise residential buildings, hospitals, and care homes of at least 18m or at least seven storeys in height



As you know we appointed a new Head of Resident Safety, **Neil Wilmer**, last year to help us plan ahead and we already have an extensive programme of work in place to allow us to comply with the forthcoming changes.

SPICY SUMMER PASTA SALAD

Make this colourful, spicy salad the day before you serve it.

Toss fusilli pasta with tomato juice, olive oil, vinegar, chilli powder and paprika, then add a mix of red and green peppers, sweetcorn, coriander, spring onions, Parmesan, and chicken.

INGREDIENTS

Serves: 8

- 4.5L (8 pints) water
- 1 (500g) packet fusilli pasta
- 275ml (10 fl oz) tomato juice
- 1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
 1 1/2 teaspoons chilli powder
- 3/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 50g (2oz) freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- 75g (3oz) frozen sweetcorn, cooked
- handful chopped fresh coriander
- 1/2 bunch spring onions, chopped
- 1/2 red pepper, diced
- 1/2 green pepper, diced
- 1 skinless, boneless chicken breast fillet, poached and diced



Spicy Summer Pasta Salad

METHOD

Prep: 30min Cook: 10min Ready in: 40min

- Cook pasta according to packet instructions; drain.
- 2. Stir the tomato juice, olive oil, vinegar, chilli powder, paprika, salt, and black pepper together. Toss it with the drained pasta and refrigerate for 2 to 4 hours.
- 3. Combine the Parmesan, sweetcorn, coriander, spring onions, red pepper, green pepper, and diced chicken breast. Toss with the chilled pasta mixture and cover and refrigerate for at least 8 hours or overnight before serving.
